

Confluence of Little Senachewine Creek and Senachewine Creek, extreme NE Peoria County, in 1939 (left) and 1998 (right). Little Senachewine shows little change, but the confluence was pirated by downstream migration of a Senachewine Creek meander. Other meanders show mainly downstream migration of 300-500 ft (5-8 ft/yr) over the period. The main change in the landscape was increased density of the forest cover on high sloping areas and along drainages, and a more continuous riparian forest cover. Flow is towards bottom of page.
